



[Tec de Monterrey](#) has been invited to participate in [World Economic Forum activities for Davos 2023](#), thus becoming the only Latin American university with an official presence at the summit.

Rector and Executive President David Garza will represent the Tec from January 16 to 20 at this global summit.

This meeting will bring together more than **2,500 government, enterprise, and civil society leaders** to discuss the topic of ***“Cooperation in a Fragmented World.”***

The Tec will form part of the **select group of 17 universities** to be represented by their leaders, including the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT), the National University of Singapore, and the University of Tokyo.

“Receiving this invitation is an honor, which enables us to renew our commitment to strengthening the Tec’s internationalization efforts, thus allowing us to make a greater impact to the benefit of society,” emphasized Garza.



Davos 2023 aims to be a key platform for encouraging solutions with a vision of the future and addressing the most pressing global challenges through public-private cooperation.

In 2022, David Garza joined the boards of international academic organizations on the Tec's behalf, such as the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges (SACSCOC), the Association of Pacific Rim Universities (APRU), and Universitas 21 (U21).

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
